The below table identifies the difference in crime in the University Hills neighborhood comparing 2004 to 2005 year to date (10/12/05). As you can see there has been a very small increase in nearly every category. The frequency of larcenies (thefts) has actually gone down. Your email to Councilwoman Lehman expresses concern regarding the level of thefts from motor vehicles. There has been one more incident over ten and one-half months comparing 2004 data to 2005. There has been seven more incident of burglary over ten and one-half months comparing 2004 data to 2005.
